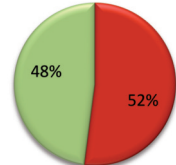
1.2 Should we bring in a voluntary code of conduct for businesses encouraging them to park away from Main Street so as to free up spaces for shoppers?



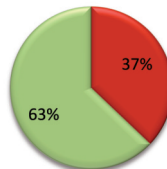

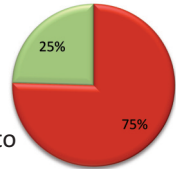

Speed Limits and Road Crossings...and a question about our boundaries

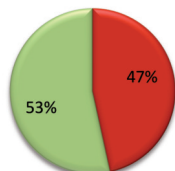
1.8 Do you support reducing the speed limit on the A56 between Castle Park and Helsby High School to 40 mph?



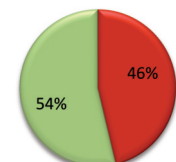
1.9 Do you support reducing the speed limit on the A56 between Castle Park and Tarvin Road (near the Netherton Hall pub) to 30mph?



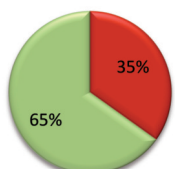

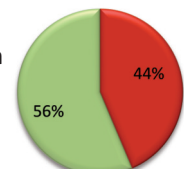

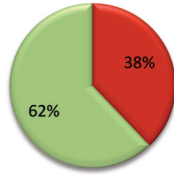

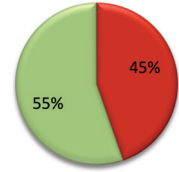

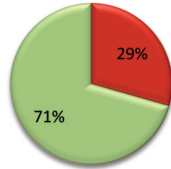

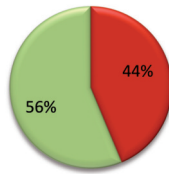

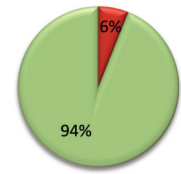


Swing Bridge on the A56

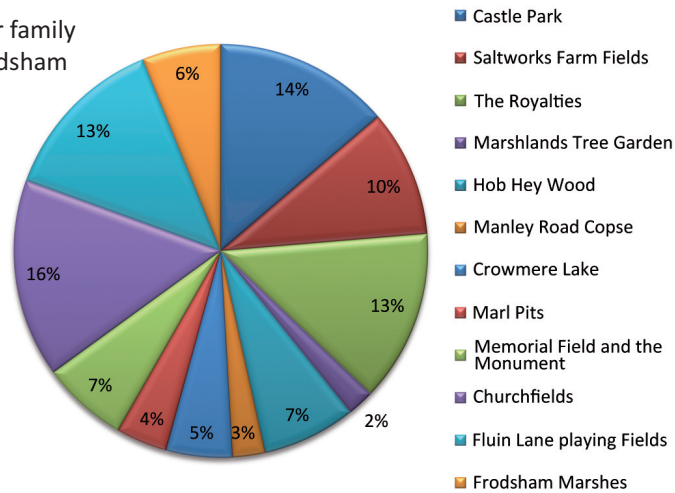

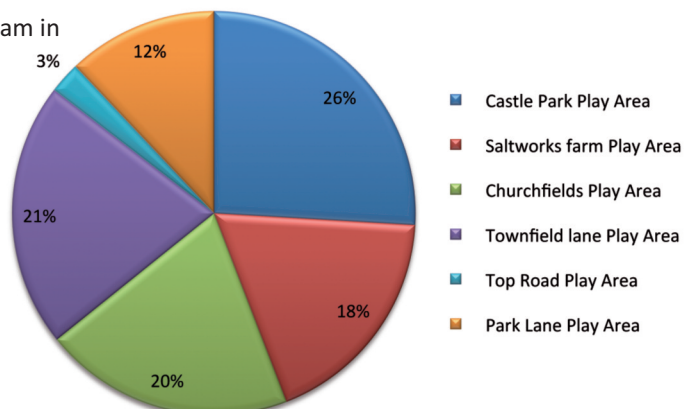

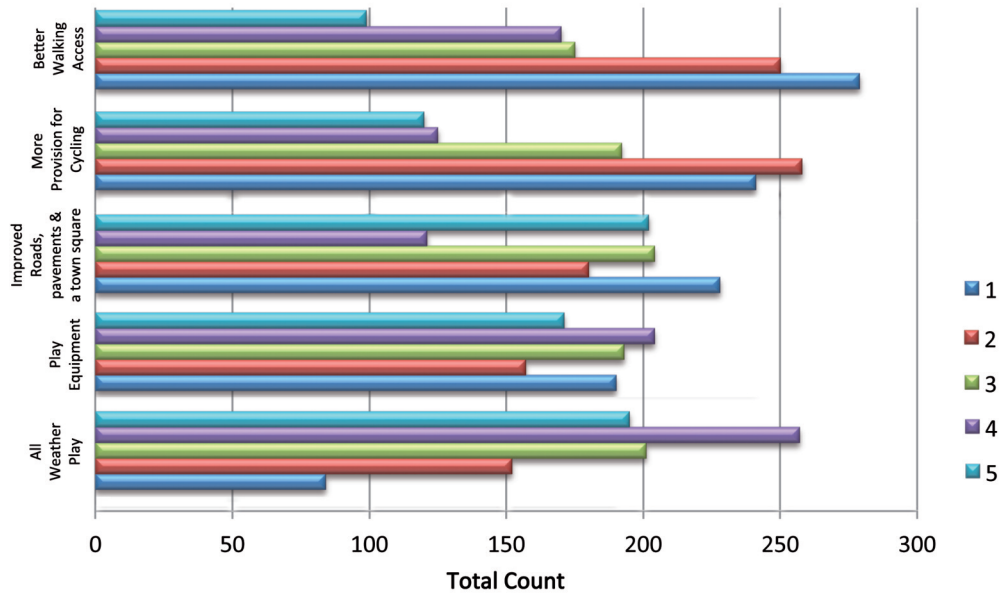

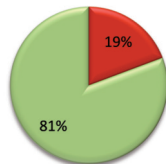

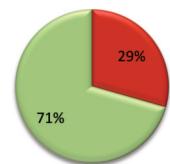

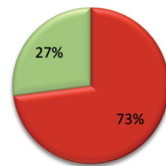

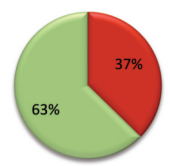

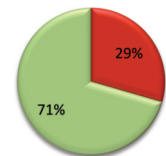

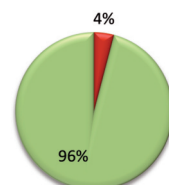

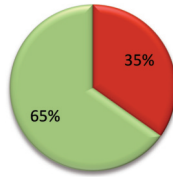

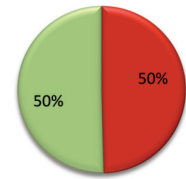

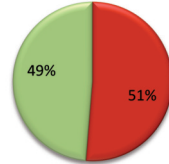

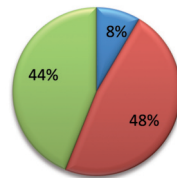

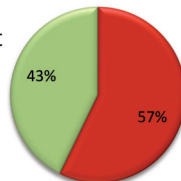

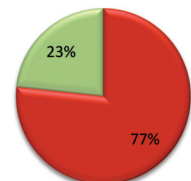

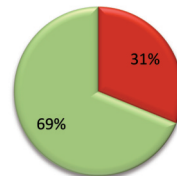

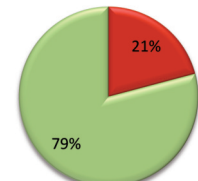

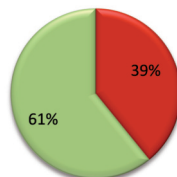

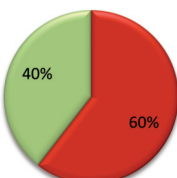

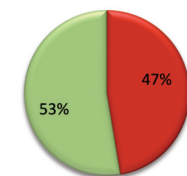

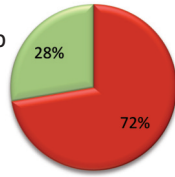

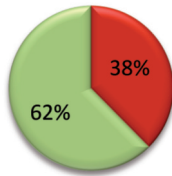

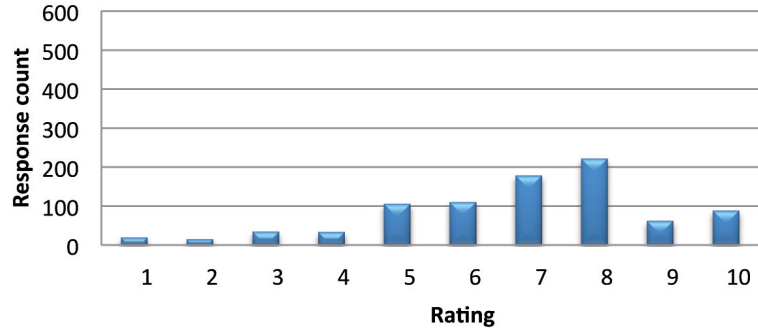

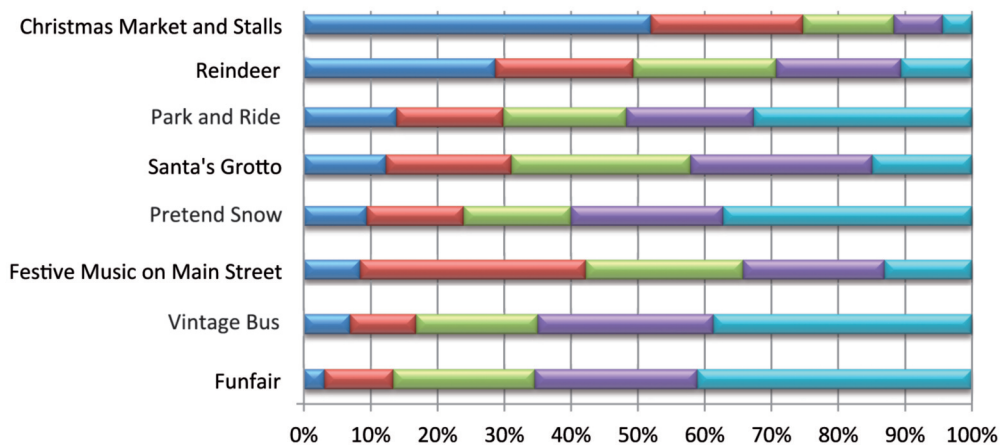

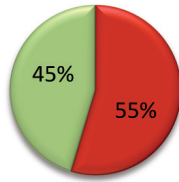

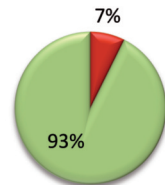

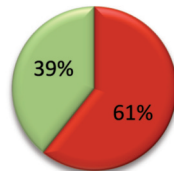

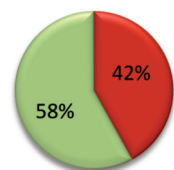

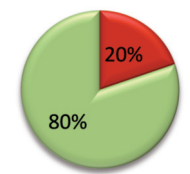


The Goods Shed

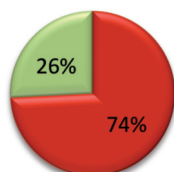

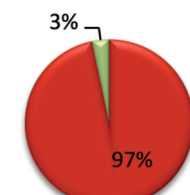
